



Insurable Values and Abandonment Thresholds

Fresh Market Vegetables – Acreage-Loss Basis 2024 Feature Sheet

When you enroll in Production Insurance for fresh market vegetables – acreage-loss basis, the insurable value of your crop, along with your coverage level, is the basis of your premium rate and any potential claims you receive. If damage results in an early abandonment claim and not all costs are incurred, then non-incurred costs may be removed, reducing the insurable value.

Agricorp compares any losses you experience against predetermined abandonment thresholds. These thresholds are based on the crop yields required to meet average production costs for a typical field of that crop, while considering that producers retain the right to salvage any remaining yield from the damaged acres. An abandonment claim may be paid if your yield falls below the threshold level due to an insured peril.
